

Prevention of Cruelty to Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Amendment (Restrictions on Stock Animal Procedures) Bill 2019 (NSW) SHEET



The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals **Amendment (Restrictions on Stock** Animal Procedures) Bill 2019 ("the Bill") was introduced into the NSW Parliament by the Hon. Mark Pearson MLC of the Animal Justice Party. A parliamentary committee is now conducting an inquiry into the Bill, and wants to hear from the public about what the Bill is trying to do.

What is "mulesing"?

Mulesing is a practice that involves cutting slices of skin from the hindquarters of sheep bred for wool, to stop flies laying eggs in folds of the very wrinkly skin of these wool sheep.



It is usually done without anaesthetics or pain relief.

What is the purpose of the Bill?

The Bill would make mulesing sheep an animal cruelty offence by inserting new section 23B titled 'Mules operation prohibited' into the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1979 (NSW).

The Bill would also make pain relief mandatory for other painful procedures routinely performed on farmed animals eg:

- Branding
- · Ear-marking or ear-tagging
- Castrating cattle, sheep or goats (<6 months old), and pigs (<2 months old)
- Dehorning goats (<1 month old) and cattle (<12 months old)
- Tailing sheep <6 months old

Why the ADO supports the Bill

Mulesing is a very painful procedure, yet is legal everywhere in Australia. Only Victoria requires that pain relief be used. The wool industry has long been aware of the negative animal welfare impacts of mulesing, but has failed to reform the practice or implement alternatives. Updating the law merely to require pain relief (as in Victoria) is **not enough**, as too hard to enforce, and the types of pain relief allowed may not be effective or long-lasting. The practice should be **completely banned** as the Bill proposes. The industry will cope as some wool farmers have already stopped mulesing.
